

Piotr Wilczek appointed Ambassador to Washington, DC

On November 9, the Ambassador of the Republic of Poland to the United States of America, Piotr

Wilczek, presented copies of Letters of Credence at the State Department.

Ambassador Piotr Wilczek is a prolific literary scholar, intellectual historian, writer, and translator. He graduated from the University of Silesia in Katowice, where he also received his Ph.D. and *Habilitation*. Recruited by his *Alma Mater*, he remained there until 2008 as a professor and Faculty Dean. His interests include comparative literature, philology, and intellectual history that form the culture and geography of knowledge across time. In 2006, he received the title of Professor of the Humanities from the President of the Republic of Poland.
