Dear Mr. Holt.

On behalf of the Polish-American community in Memphis Metropolitan Area I am asking you to kindly consider Poland as a theme country for the 2015 edition of the Memphis in May International Festival.

About 200 families of Polish origin live currently in the Memphis area. Many of them are immigrants who came to the U.S. during the 1980's, the times when martial law was introduced by the Polish communist regime in order to put an end to the Solidarity opposition. However, the movement was not suppressed and in 1989 the communist government ceased to exist. This unprecedented historical event set an example for other countries creating a domino effect and finally led to the fall of communism in the Soviet Union.

Poland is now an important member of the European Union and NATO and one of only a few in Europe who evaded the recent economic recession.

Poland played a significant role many a time in the history. On September 11, 1683 near Vienna Polish King Jan Sobieski led Europe's forces of 80,000 against the Ottoman Empire army of 300,000 and stopped their invasion of the European continent. The September 11 date became a symbol and in 2001 was chosen by Al-Qaeda to avenge the 1683 Ottoman defeat. In 1920 Polish Army stopped the Red Army in their attempt to spread communism in West Europe. Polish generals, Casimir Pulaski and Taddeus Kosciuszko, became heroes in the American Revolutionary War. In the recent years Polish and American troops fought side by side in Afghanistan and Iraq.

The Polish-American community of Memphis is very active in promoting solidarity values, cultural heritage and international friendship. We are proud of our Nicolas Copernicus School of Polish Culture and Language, we take part in multinational events such as Germantown International Festival and sponsor Polish-American artists. We have strong ties with the Embassy of Poland in Washington D.C. who is willing to endorse our request to consider Poland in the 2015 MIM Festival and support our future participation if such an opportunity occurs.

Again, we kindly ask you to consider our proposal.

Let me emphasize that we are truly appreciate your involvement in the creation of the project "Memphis in May". Through such undertakings many ethnic communities in the U.S. have the opportunity to present the best achievements of their countries. They can introduce their culture, traditions and customs. We really do hope that the Polish community in Memphis also will have the opportunity to present our country. Also we would be really grateful if you could take into consideration selecting Poland as a country of "Memphis in May 2015".

In these last few years, Poland's significance around the world is increasing, and the importance of the Polish diaspora is expected to grow, along with the quality of its representatives beyond Poland's borders. In order for this to happen, new and innovative ways of communication and initiatives are needed. Poland has changed — our country is viewed not as a security consumer but as a security provider. In the European Union, which is currently trying to overcome its biggest financial challenges, Poland is widely considered as an important part of the solution.

Nowadays, in the most recent Census, 9.8 million Americans, about 3% of the US population, admitted to having Polish roots, also the Polish generation living abroad represent a completely different generation of the Polish diaspora. It is a generation of well-educated people, who understand the conditions and situation of the country that they live in.

In Poland, authorities and organizations have also taken upon themselves to support initiatives for Poles living abroad. A good example of this is the Polish-American Society, launched by the Polish-American living in Tennessee. Let me highlight how much I appreciate their involvement and commitment in promoting Polish culture and history as well as teaching the community about Poland.

We kindly ask you to consider Poland as a theme country for the MIM 2015 and I fully hope that this event will provide an opportunity for all participants to exchange information, innovative ideas, knowledge and experience and you will be able to expand your network of contacts and friends.





First Site Visit of MIM Delegation to Poland



Memphis in May International Festival Advance Site Visit to Poland – General Report

A delegation representing MIMIF consisting of Jim Holt, President & CEO and Randy Blevins, VP of Programming traveled to Poland October 11-18, 2014 with Wei Chen, Board Chairman and Ernest Strickland, Memphis Chamber joining October 13 & 14. The group was hosted by the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Polish Press Agency who coordinated the itinerary of visits and meetings.

Highlights include meetings with Piotr Erenfeicht, Ministry of Foreign Affairs; Urszula Penczek, Ministry of Culture and National Heritage; Zofia Schnitzer, Ministry of Economy; Robert Kepinski, Polish Tourist Organization as well as many insightful visits.

The delegation visited the capital city of Warsaw as well as Krakow.

Merriweather's 2015 mixed media work entitled "Poland" illustrates the vibrant and colorful culture of Poland while honoring its rich history. "Poland" showcases the natural beauty of the honored country and pays tribute to the artistry found in Poland's deep cultural heritage.

The honored country has many stories to tell with a history tracing back to medieval times and a focus on building a reputation not only on its history, but on its standing as a modern, contemporary, and financially stable country. Merriweather's "Poland" is meant to serve as an inviting introduction to these great stories.

Merriweather attended Jackson State University before earning his MFA from Memphis College of Art and later participated in the prestigious Skowhegan School. His work has been featured in numerous exhibitions locally, nationally, and abroad over the past 15 years including the Zacheta National Gallery of Art in Warsaw, Poland; Studio Museum in Harlem, New York; and the Dixon Gallery in Memphis. His public art project produced for the Whitehaven Library with the Urban Art Commission is a beloved landmark of the neighborhood. Through his role as a curatorial director at the Fogelman Galleries of Contemporary Art at the University of Memphis and prominent projects, Merriweather continues to contribute to the cultural

vibrancy of the city.

The competition is open to students in grades 4-12 attending any public, private, or home school within the Memphis metro area. First, second, and third place winners will be chosen in three grade categories: Upper Elementary, 4th & 5th grades;

Junior, 6th- 8th grades; Senior, 9th - 12th grades.

K-6 Grade Students

This competition promotes the creative artistry of students in grades K – 6. Patterned after Memphis in May's Fine Art Poster Program, the student's work must depict some aspect of the honored country through the medium of drawing and coloring. One student will become the Grand Prize winner, and his/her work will then be printed and sold by Memphis in May as the 2015 International Children's Poster. The Grand Prize winner will sign and number 100 of the prints. Since there will be a limited number of signed and numbered prints, this lucky young artist's poster has the potential of becoming a unique collector's item. First, second, and third place winners will also be chosen in three grade categories:

Its location has also developed it into a country of striking contrasts, like the contemporary skyscrapers of Warsaw against a country side where horse-drawn carts negotiate peaceful lanes. Even though a growing number of tourists visit Poland every year, it has managed to maintain a largely untouched and uncompromised charm which make it enchanting. Even though it is situated in the plains of central Europe, Poland has a varied landscape - from the Tatra Mountains in the south, through vast areas of primeval forests and encless lowlands, to the beautifully enticing beaches of the northern Baltic coast.

Despite the fact that much of Poland was horribly battered and occupied throughout World War II, an impressive amount of historic beauty remains. The city of Warsaw even decided to completely reconstruct the whole historic Old City. Many other cities that were destroyed in the war have also painstakingly rebuilt their historic cores. You're never far from a castle or cathedral that lend a regal element to medieval city-capes.

You're also never far from an intriguing tale - some are fictional, about dragons and knights - while others, like those about Popes and heroes and stargazers, are not.

Poland also offers some of the highest highs and lowest lows. Visitors experience bright celebrations, enjoy the charm and hospitality of centres and old towns, and explore some of Europe's best mountain, coastal and lake scenery. Conversely, many modern buildings speak treasures lost and cities leveled, some bleak Communist architecture exist next to beautiful Gothic castles or Renaissance catherdrals and speak of years of enemy occupation, and the haunting walls of Auschwitz remind every Pole of a dark time that stole a fifth of the

country's entire population.

It has been said that those times of "lows," especially throughout much of the 20th Century, make it

much of the 20th Century, make it more difficult for Poles to celebrate their country's grandeur... however curriculum guide will spend the next pages doing just that.

Q&A: Jacek Dutkiewicz

Senior research fellow for Georgia-Pacific's operations in Memphis and president of the Polish-American Society of Memphis.

A rtist, musician, composer, inventor, professor, scientist — it's difficult to define Dr. Jacek Dutkiewicz, senior research fellow for Georgia-Pacific's operations in Memphis and since 2008 president of the Polish-American Society in Memphis. Born in Poland "several years ago," as Dutkiewicz says, his education and career have taken him to universities throughout his native country, to Zaire, then to the United States, where he taught at the University of Washington. Along the way he has filed dozens of patents, published some 200 articles, and written two books about paper manufacturing and technology. A job offer from the Kimberly-Clark Corporation took him to the company headquarters in Wisconsin, and from there he came to Memphis, where he has lived with his wife, Halina, since 1998. He talks about his native country, this year's salute to Poland by the Memphis in May International Festival, and misconceptions many Americans have about the Polish people.

First of all, let me say that you have one of the most impressive resumes of anyone I've ever interviewed.

Thank you. I enjoy research. I earned a master of science degree and then two doctoral degrees in engineering from Lodz Institute of Technology. The president of Poland has also presented me with the "Professor" title, the highest academic degree my country offers.

Does the rest of your family share your enthusiasm for science and education?

Oh yes. Halina — my perfect wife, my inspiration, my motivation, my great love, with whom I have spent 42 years — also earned a master's degree. In fact, that's how we met, while attending school. Our son, Radek, is married and both he and wife Laurie are successful medical doctors living in Oregon. Our daughter, Magda, is a senior market research manager and lives in Nashville with her husband, Victor, an IT engineer.

Before coming to the U.S., you spent some time in Africa.

As a young boy, I always wanted to visit Africa, and I got a job offer to teach in Zaire. For several years I was director of the chemical engineering department at the University of Lubumbashi.

What eventually brought you to the U.S.?

I received an invitation from the University of Washington, but Poland was still a closed country, so my family had to stay behind. But I fell in love with this country. A few years later, the Kimberly-Clark Corporation heard about my research [in paper making] and offered me a position. By this time Poland had become more open, and I had spent my life in academia and I wanted a chance to work in the real world. We spent six years in Neenah, Wisconsin, but grew tired of the weather there.

So you found your way to Memphis.

I liked Memphis because I knew it was a center for musicians. I had reached a point in my life where I had to decide to be a scientist, or a musician. My wife convinced me that a scientist would let me see my family more [laughs].

Let's talk about the Polish community in Memphis.

It's a close community, but not a very large one. Perhaps 150 Polish families live here. But what many people don't understand is how large Polish communities are in other cities. More Poles are living in Chicago than actually live in Warsaw. And if you go to Walgreens, you'll see they now offer prescriptions in seven different languages, and one of those is Polish. So that says something, when Polish is considered one of the seven most common languages in the world.



When was the Polish-American Society of Memphis formed?

A fellow Pole, Len Jankowski, began the society in 1978. It was mainly formed of doctors, engineers, scientists, and others who had come to this country after the war. Younger people came later. (For more information: pasofmemphis.com)

What is the purpose of the society?

We try to remind people of the rich traditions of Poland. In 2006, my wife founded the Nicolas Copernicus School of Polish Culture and Language. We have classes at the Bert Ferguson Community Center in Cordova, teaching language and arts. And we also hold special events. In Poland, Christmas Eve is the biggest event of the year, so we try to have a traditional Polish Christmas Eve, with dinner, children putting on plays, and other activities.

How else do the Polish people get involved in the local community?

We are a big part of the Germantown International Festival, usually held in August. It's a wonderful experience, featuring some 30 ethnic groups. And we are all friends with the other cultural groups. It just shows that friends can be made easily if you're not affected by politics.

Any other Polish events on the calendar?

Usually in September, we will hold a celebration we call "Farewell to the Summer." And we have various holidays throughout the year. May 3rd is Polish Constitution Day. Not many people realize that Poland has the second oldest constitution in the world, drafted in 1793 and second only to the U.S. [1787].

And this year Memphis in May is saluting your country.

Yes, even though it took them 39 years to do so [laughs]. That is actually a large honor. The Polish Embassy has declared Memphis in May the most important event promoting Poland in the United States this year. The calendar of events includes the Cracovia Danza Court Ballet, screenings of Polish movies, artworks, music. A cooking team called the Polska Porkers is taking part in the barbecue contest.


What else do you do to enhance Polish-American relationships?

We had a role in developing the curriculum guide that is given to schoolteachers, as part of Memphis in May's educational materials about the honored country. I am also a member of the Advisory Council of the U.S. Embassy. We meet twice a year, and discuss changes we'd like to see. Did you know, for instance, that Poland is one of the few countries in the European Union that still requires a visa to come to the U.S.?

What would you like Americans to know about Poland?

I don't think many realize the important role Poles have played in the world. The musician Chopin, the astronomer Copernicus, the scientist Marie Curie — all came from Poland. People think Curie was French, but her maiden name was Sklowdoska. Two U.S. generals in the Revolutionary War — Casimir Pulaski and Thadeus Kosciuszko — were Polish. They both have cities named after them here, but Americans don't pronounce the name the way Poles do [laughs].

A CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS

Piotr Lewicki, born 1966 in Zabrze, is a graduate of the August Witkowski High School in Kraków (1985) and the Faculty of Architecture, Kraków University of Technology (1990, doctoral thesis 1999). From 1992–99 he taught at the Urban Design Institute (Kraków University of Technology) and from 2003–2009 at the Faculty of Architecture and Fine Arts at Kraków Frycz Modrzewski Academy. Member of the Polish Association of Architects and Polish Chamber of Architects obtained his professional license in 2002.

Lewicki Latak, today a well known Polish architectural practice and winner of awards from architectural competitions. These awards include most notably the Kraków designs such as Heroes of the Ghetto Square and Nowy Square, Cracovia Centennial Sport Hall, the Kazimierz – Ludwinów pedestrian and bicycle bridge over the Vistula river. The Heroes of the Ghetto Square also received honorable mention in the prestigious European Prize for Urban Public Space competition (Barcelona, 2006) and the Gold Award in the Urban Quality Award competition (Frankfurt am Main, 2011). The firm's Corte Verona apartment building project in Wrocław received the Grand Prix in the Beatiful Wrocław competition for the best design of the year (2010), honorable mention in the national Award of the Year competition, and was a finalist in the Life in Architecture competition (2012). These projects, as well as others, have been covered in both the Polish and international media.

Piotr Lewicki and Kazimierz Łatak received the prestigious Kraków Association of Architects' Award in 2004 and were recipients as well as Professional of the Year (2013) awarded by Forbes magazine.




Edward is also the author of "Brush with the Edge of Time and Profession". Here is what he says about his book:
